**TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER AND ORDER
SETTING HEARING FOR TEMPORARY INJUNCTION**

On this day, came to be heard the City of Dallas’s Request for Temporary Restraining Order. Attorneys for the City of Dallas appeared in person. Defendants, S&B Hot Mess Enterprises, LLC d/b/a Salon A La Mode and Shelley Luther did ~~not~~ appear, *via Counsel*,

City of Dallas, Plaintiff, has filed a verified petition for a temporary injunction and, in connection therewith, has presented a request for a temporary restraining order, as set forth in the *City of Dallas’s Original Petition, Request for Temporary Restraining Order, Request for Temporary and Permanent Injunctions, and Request for Disclosures* (“Original Petition”). It clearly appears from the facts set forth in Plaintiff’s Original Petition that unless Defendants are immediately ordered to cease and desist from operating the Salon A La Mode business for in-person services located at 7989 Belt Line Road, Ste. 139-1C, Dallas, Texas in violation of State of Texas, Dallas County, and ^{on} City of Dallas emergency regulations related to the COVID-19 pandemic, that Defendants will continue to commit the foregoing acts before notice can be given and a hearing is set on Plaintiff’s motion for temporary injunction. In addition, if the commission of the acts is not restrained immediately, City of Dallas and Dallas County residents will suffer irreparable injury from the adverse public health effects caused by the substantial risk of continuing the spread of the deadly COVID-19 disease that is easily transmitted through person

to person contact, especially in group settings, and because the rapid spread of the disease threatens to overwhelm local health care facilities.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Defendants are immediately ordered to cease and desist from operating the Salon A La Mode business for in-person services located at 7989 Belt Line Road, Ste. 139-1C, Dallas, Texas in violation of State of Texas, Dallas County, and City of Dallas emergency regulations related to the COVID-19 pandemic

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the clerk shall issue notice to Defendants of the hearing on Plaintiff's application for temporary injunction. The purpose of this hearing shall be to determine whether this temporary restraining order should be made a temporary injunction pending a full trial on the merits.

This Order expires on May 12th, 2020, and the hearing on Plaintiff's application for temporary injunction is set for May 11th, 2020 at 1⁰² ~~am~~/p.m.

No bond is necessary to be posted by Plaintiff, City of Dallas.
