It appears that harvesting of ballots by mail occurred in Harris County during the 2018 Democratic Primary, especially in Precinct #0259, and that this activity may have begun in 2008.

Multiple similarities found in the ballot by mail applications, the ballot carrier envelops, as well as the actual ballots themselves are too great to be coincidence.

Convicted forgers obtaining large batches of ballot by mail applications as well as convicted forgers being paid by campaigns and/or PACs supplying workers or services to campaigns increases the probability that organized mailed ballot fraud may be occurring.

Local officials cannot investigate these allegations without creating a clear conflict of interest. That is because campaign records show that many of these local officials have directly or indirectly employed one or more persons convicted of forgery in their own campaigns.

Therefore, I am requesting that this information be forwarded to the Texas Attorney General for investigation.

The voters involved need to be interviewed to confirm who assisted them with their applications and/or mailed ballots.

- The video posted by Direct Action Texas exposed the possibility of fraud in the 2018 Harris
  County Democratic Primary Election which led me to file public information requests (PIRs) for
  the mail ballot applications, ballot carrier envelopes, and signature verification documents used
  in that race. (Exhibit #1)
- In reviewing the applications, I found three sets of applications with disturbingly similar handwriting. These sets also had strong similarities in envelopes, stamps, and precinct number – mainly #0259. I titled the sets:
  - alleged harvester A (Exhibit #3)
  - alleged harvester B (Exhibit #4)
  - alleged harvester C (Exhibit #5)
- 3. In reviewing the signature verification documents provided in my PIRs, I found similar hand-writing on applications back as far as 2008 for alleged harvester A.(Exhibits #3d, #3e, #3f + #3g)
- 4. The audio made available by Jasen Rabalais, led me to believe that if harvesting did occur, there may have been competing entities urging the voters to file multiple applications. (Exhibit #2)
- So I filed another PIR for "all" mail ballot applications related to the voter names on the A list. I
  now believe that I have found all the applications from set A. (I am still in the process of filing
  PIRs related to the all voter names in B and C.)
- 6. To see if I could find a similar repetitive pattern in the ballots themselves, I filed a PIR for copies of the mail ballots from 11 precincts those covered by voters in A, B and C as well as some surrounding precincts in Harold Dutton's district. I chose Precincts #0047, #0048, #0138, #0145, #0253, #0259, #0353, #0455, #0580, #0582, #0606. (Note: I could not afford a PIR for copies of all the ballots in the race.)
- 7. I had to wait until the ballots were available for public viewing 22 months after the election which was January of 2020.
- 8. The pattern found in the ballots came from Precinct #0259. With 107 candidates and propositions on the ballot, Precinct #0259 had 30 identical ballots. Even the check marks used were identical. I could not find the same voting pattern on any ballot from the other precincts we copied. There were also 2 ballots which were identical to the 30 except for one race which was marked differently. Consequently, alleged harvester A had 32 applications from Precinct #0259. The numbers are too close to just pass off as coincidence. (Exhibits #6a + #6b)
- From Precinct #0259 I also found 6 sets of ballots where 2 voters marked the exact same candidates. I don't find this concerning. It could be two voters in a household voting the same or simply a coincidence. (Exhibit #6c)

- 10. One ballot each was found in Precincts #0047, #0580, and #0606 in which the voter chose only 2 of the 97 candidates on the ballot - Harold Dutton and Sheila Jackson Lee. The other candidates on the ballot were left blank. Those ballots support the video evidence in #1. (Exhibit #7)
- 11. The ballot applications used by A, B and C appeared to be the type made available by the Harris County Clerk's Office, so I filed a PIR for the list of persons who picked up large batches of applications in 2018. I received a copy of the sign out sheet for 2018. (Exhibit #8a)
- 12. It's very suspicious that the woman who was taped in #4 explaining her harvesting services, not only has a previous forgery conviction, but was the first person to pick up a batch of applications from the County Clerk's Office in 2018. On 1/5/2018 she picked up 50 for the Sheila Jackson Lee campaign. On 8/22/2018 she had 250 more picked up in her name. (Exhibits #2, #8a, #8b)
- 13. It is also very concerning that the third person who picked up a batch of 50 ballots from the County Clerk's Office in 2018 likewise had a previous forgery conviction. She picked up applications for the Sharon Burney campaign on 1/11/18. (Exhibits #8a + #8b)
- 14. The fourth batch of 50 applications picked up from the County Clerk's Office in 2018 was for Deborah Adams. Writing samples from provisional ballots completed by Deborah Adams when she served as the Election Judge for Precinct #0259 appear to match the writing samples of alleged harvester A. (Exhibits #3h + #8a)
- 15. After finding two persons with previous forgery convictions picking up large batches of ballot by mail applications from the County Clerk's Office for local campaigns, I decided to find out how wide spread the practice of Harris County campaigns paying convicted forgers might be. I found so many elected officials who have either:
  - paid convicted forgers with campaign funds,
  - paid a PAC with campaign funds which in turn has convicted forgers on the PAC's
  - · accepted "in kind" donations of campaign personnel from a PAC which pays convicted forgers

that I do not feel our local officials can investigate these allegations without a clear conflict of interest. I have included examples of all three. (Exhibits #9a + #9b)
