We resumed cruising over the July 4th weekend with Carnival Vista departing from Galveston and Carnival Horizon departing Miami. Carnival Breeze returns to service from Galveston on Thursday with Carnival Miracle operating our Alaska cruises later this month and Mardi Gras setting sail from Port Canaveral for the first time July 31. We resume West Coast operations in August from Long Beach aboard Panorama. We have other ships resuming service in August (it would be 8 total)

There is a process by which unvaccinated guests may sail. We have been sailing with 95 percent guests and crew vaccinated since we started sailing July 4th weekend.

Currently, Carnival Cruise Line is requiring guests provide proof of vaccination before boarding out of Galveston, Texas. What're the exemptions to this policy, if any?

Has there been any communications with state officials regarding recently signed Senate Bill 968, prohibiting vaccine passports in the state? What were the nature of those communications? What has Carnival's legal department found in SB 968 where they believe this policy is permitted under state law?
