Mayor Williams forwarded your email to me.

I'm not sure where the 7,000 number is coming from. The City of Abilene Charter requires a petition to have 10% of the qualified voters from the last municipal election sign. The last election had **64,289 voters**.

Therefore the total required signatures would be 6,429 signatures. There is no specific time frame for them to get signatures though. The only deadlines kick in after they turn the petition into my office. I have 20 days to verify signatures at that point. There are also deadlines for it to be presented to Council after that date, and then if Council votes to not pass the ordinance, there would be deadlines regarding a special election. All of that would depend on when they turn the petition in though.

If this all came to pass and the election was in the affirmative, yes, there would then be an ordinance declaring Abilene a sanctuary city for the unborn.

Hopefully that answers your questions. Feel free to let me know if you need additional information.
