District 6: Cathy Mincberg. Texas constitutional amendments The Chronicle recommends that Propositions 1, 4, 7 and 17 be rejected.

Proposition 1: Increasing salaries for legislators: Vote against.

Proposition 2: \$500 million in water and flood control bonds. Vote for.

Proposition 3: Financing farm and business development. Vote for.

Proposition 4: Exempts non-profit veterans organizations from ad valorem taxes. Vote against.

Proposition 5: "Export amendment" would exempt goods in transit from ad valorem taxes to encourage business. Vote for.

Proposition 6: Authorize hospital district members to serve four-year terms. Vote for.

Proposition 7: Change oath of office to switch from oral to written the declaration that no bribery committed. Vote against.

Proposition 8: Finances construction of prison and mental health facilities. Vote for.

Proposition 9: Reorganizes and combines criminal justice agencies. Vote for.

Proposition 10: Authorizes juries to be informed of parole and good conduct time. Vote for.

Proposition 11: Sets per diem for legislators at level permitted under federal income tax. Vote for.

Proposition 12: Allows permanent school funds to guarantee state bonds issued to aid school districts. Vote for.

Proposition 13: Provides a bill of rights for crime victims. Vote for.

Proposition 14: Concerns election of Fort Bend County district attorneys. Vote for.

Proposition 15: Permits raffles by non-profit groups for charity purposes. Vote for.

Proposition 16: Grants citizens the right to decide whether to create hospital districts. Vote for.

Proposition 17: Authorizes use of state funds for loans and grants to local fire departments. Vote against.

Proposition 18: Deals with issuance of agricultural water conservation bonds. Vote for.

Proposition 19: Authorizes local governments to invest funds as authorized by the Legislature. Vote for.

Proposition 20: Abolishes the post of surveyor in Harris and six other counties. Vote for.

Proposition 21: Allows issuance of general obligation bonds as college savings bonds to provide loans to students. Vote for. Bond issues

A proposal by the county to issue \$5 million in bonds to build a fire training facility. Vote for.

A proposal by the Port of Houston Authority to issue \$130 million in bonds to widen and deepen the Ship Channel. Vote for.
