Solution Sought On School Issue

ATHENS — The controversial issue of sex education in Athens Public Schools may have moved nearer a solution during a special meeting of the Athens School Board here Thursday night.

The board voted at the meeting to amend the original resolution on the sex education course and re-submit the consent forms to the parents in a "Hopefully more understandable form."

Robert Fields presided over the meeting which was attended by a standing-room-only crowd of opponents to the program who overflowed the small administration office and filled most of the hall.

Other members of the board are Bill Erwin, secretary, Frank R. Dorsey, Bill Caldwell, Dr. Curtis Boyd, Dr. Dwight Jones, and Willis D. Moore.

Object of the special meeting was the proposed "Family Liv-

ing" program which was approved during the regular meeting of the board on July 6, 1967. According to the minutes of that meeting, "a motion was made and seconded that a sex education program be started in September, 1967, in the school system and that it be taught and coordinated by the school nurse with the regular classroom teacher present in the classroom during presentation of
