Whereas the above named institutions recognize that cooperating would be of mutual benefit and would serve as an indication of continued interest in joint activities, it is agreed the institutions will explore:

- 1. The exchange of faculty for joint teaching and research programs,
- 2. Encouraging the enrollment of qualified students in the other's academic programs,
- 3. Avenues for strengthening their relationship and furthering excellence in United States and China education, and
- 4. The development of a more detailed Program Agreement.

Texas A&M University has sole responsibility as the home institution for U.S. Title IV financial aid processing, disbursement, and record keeping for any Texas A&M University student participating in programs described by this Agreement. Ocean University of China will provide less than 50% of the coursework applied to the Texas A&M University degree being pursued by Texas A&M University students under this Agreement.

Whereas the above named institutions recognize that a Program Agreement would be of mutual benefit and would provide to continue the existing agreement with the College of Geosciences, it is agreed that:

Faculty

1.01 Each institution will promote the exchange of faculty for teaching and/or for collaborative research programs in the area of geosciences.

Students

- 2.01 Each institution will promote the enrollment of qualified undergraduate and/or graduate students in the other's academic programs. Each student involved in these programs will be subject to the admission requirements and tuition and fees of the host institution. Language competency must be at a level that will allow participating students to attend classes in the language of the host institution.
- 2.02 Texas A&M University has sole responsibility as the home institution for U.S. Title IV financial aid processing, disbursement, and record keeping for any Texas A&M University student participating in programs described by this Agreement. Ocean University will provide less than 50% of the coursework applied to the Texas A&M University degree being pursued by Texas A&M University students under this Agreement.
- 2.03 Students will be responsible for their own transportation to and from the host institution, as well as for their room board, insurance and any other necessary fees while attending the host institution.

Term

- 3.01 This Program Agreement will become effective on the final date of signing and will have a duration of five years.
- 3.02 This Program Agreement may be terminated by either party by providing 180 days written notice to the Coordinators listed below.

Designation of Coordinators

4.01 Each party designates the following officials to serve as Coordinators under this Program Agreement. The individuals designated as Coordinators may be revised by either party by providing written notice to the current Coordinators.
