The China-US Exchange Foundation: CUSEF, a non-government non-profit entity based in Hong Kong, engages in promoting relations and facilitating exchanges between China and the United States. We shared information about the Foundation's work to various audiences and provided virtual media support. We also support the CUSEF.org.hk website and LinkedIn page, which include drafting content and performing periodic general promotional activities.

Embassy of the People's Republic of China to the U.S.: From 30 May 2017 to 28 September 2020 BLJ Worldwide supported the Embassy of the People's Republic of China to the United States in its communications and public diplomacy efforts.

Embassy of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan to the U.S.: From 19 July 2019 to 19 November 2020 BLJ Worldwide supported the Embassy of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan to the United States in its communications and public diplomacy efforts.

BLJ also helped CUSEF to engage openly with past China delegation participants including graduate students through virtual roundtables, events and a newsletter. We supported outreach to media for the following outlets:

Embassy of The People's Republic of China to the United States: BLJ and the Embassy of China have endeavored to focus on the following areas of work: 1) media training; 2) media monitoring; 3) social media; 4) strategic communications guidance and support; 5) public diplomacy support.

BLJ and the Embassy conducted three media training sessions for a group of diplomats.

BLJ conducted daily media monitoring reports for the Embassy accompanied with recommendations for action. BLJ has endeavored to provide the Embassy with media monitoring of key issues and assist in crisis management and communications when necessary.

BLJ conducted daily social media monitoring briefs. BLJ helped the Embassy maintain and enhance its social media presence, including through assistance in content curation, creation, and editing.

BLJ assisted the Embassy in crafting, editing, and placing op-eds until June 1, 2020. BLJ produced talking points for the Embassy. BLJ helped the Embassy develop the concept ideas for events to commemorate the National Day of the People's Republic of China.

The Embassy of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan in the United States: From 19 July 2019 to 19 November 2020 BLJ and the Embassy of Pakistan have endeavored to focus on the following key areas of work: 1) media relations; 2) media monitoring; 3) social media; 4) message development and key issues briefings; 5) public diplomacy support; 6) crisis communications; 7) securing and promoting webinars and virtual events; 8) supporting additional media relations for Pakistan Consulates in Houston, Los Angeles, Chicago, and New York; 9) increasing influencer relationships and facilitating networking opportunities.

BLJ and the Embassy coordinated multiple webinars around issues of interest to Pakistan, including the current situation of Kashmir and tourism promotion.

BLJ conducted daily media monitoring reports for the Embassy, as well as a daily and weekly social media monitoring reports and accompanied recommendations for action. Further, BLJ created targeted issues briefs that offer synopsis regarding media coverage about Pakistan and other relevant news stories. BLJ provided the Embassy with monitoring of daily international news and offered crisis management and communications support when necessary.

BLJ helped the Embassy maintain and enhance its social media presence, including through the assistance in content curation, creation, and editing. BLJ assisted the Embassy in drafting, editing, and placing op-eds. Further, BLJ helped the Embassy organize virtual events (since March 2020) on special commemorative days and holidays and on targeted key issues, mainly tourism promotion.

BLJ supplied the Embassy with suggested strategies and tactics to enhance its public diplomacy, as well as with ideas on how to strengthen its engagement with influencers, academic, social and business leaders.
