

Defend Texas Liberty PAC Texas Statewide 2024 Likely Republican November Issue Poll

This survey was conducted from November 20 – November 22, 2023, through a series of online surveys delivered via SMS messages. 458 survey respondents were randomly selected from a demographically proportionate sample of likely 2024 Texas Republican primary voters. Weighted demographics include partisan affiliation, age, and gender. The survey has a  $\pm 4.579\%$  margin of error with a confidence level of 95%.
