**ORDER GRANTING EXPEDITED DISCOVERY**

On this date, came to be considered Plaintiff Shana Arthur's Motion for Expedited Discovery. The Court, having considered the motion, any response thereto, the pleadings in this case, and the applicable law, is of the opinion that the motion should be GRANTED in its entirety.

The Court finds that in the interest of justice, the discovery and disclosure time periods are modified in accordance with Texas Rules of Civil Procedure 193.1 and 194.2.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Pamela Brown, in her capacity as Administrative Assistant for the City of Conroe, Texas, shall produce her notary book and appear for deposition lasting no longer than 30 minutes pursuant to Texas Rule of Civil Procedure 199.2. The deposition will be limited to any facts and/or circumstances for which she has knowledge regarding the application process for the May 4, 2024 City of Conroe General Election. The deposition of Pamela Brown will occur on March 14, 2024, at the City of Conroe City Hall.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Gary Scott, in his capacity as City Administrator for the City of Conroe, Texas, appear for deposition lasting no longer than 60 minutes, immediately following the deposition of Pamela Brown, pursuant to Texas Rule of Civil Procedure 199.2. Such deposition is limited to topics regarding the hierarchy of city

management and personnel, the role of the City Secretary, and any facts and/or circumstances for which he has knowledge regarding the application process for the May 4, 2024 City of Conroe General Election. The deposition of Gary Scott will occur on March 14, 2024, at the City of Conroe City Hall.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Defendant Soco M. Gorjon, in her capacity as City Secretary for the City of Conroe, Texas, appear for deposition lasting no longer than 90 minutes immediately following the deposition of Gary Scott, pursuant to Texas Rule of Civil Procedure 199.2. Such deposition is limited to topics regarding the acceptance of applications to be on the ballot for the May 4, 2024 City of Conroe General Election, her duties and function within city government, as well as all election deadlines regarding the May 4, 2024 City of Conroe General Election. The deposition of Defendant Soco M. Gorjon will occur on March 14, 2024, at the City of Conroe City Hall.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that pursuant to Texas Rule of Civil Procedure 196, Defendant Soco M. Gorjon, in her Official Capacity as City Secretary, produce the following documents to Plaintiff Duke W. Coon by 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, March 13, 2024:

1. All documents and/or written communications exchanged with the Office of the Conroe City Secretary and the Texas Secretary of State's office from March 1, 2024, to present.
2. All non-privileged communications pertaining to any application to be on the May 4, 2024, City of Conroe General Election Ballot.
3. Copies of all applications for the 2024 City of Conroe General Election Ballot.
4. All communications with Catherine Dominguez or any other reporter concerning the applications for the 2024 mayoral and city council elections.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that pursuant to Texas Rule of Civil Procedure 198, Defendant Soco M. Gorjon, in her Official Capacity as City Secretary, admit or deny the truth of the following matters by 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, March 13, 2024:

1. Attached as Exhibit A is a true and correct copy of the application you received and accepted for Councilman Maddux in the City of Conroe 2024 General Election.
2. You took the application from Councilman Maddux's City office on or about January 17, 2024.
3. You knew or had reason to believe that, on January 17, 2024, Councilman Maddux was not in the State of Texas.
4. Councilman Maddux instructed you to retrieve the application from his City office.
5. Councilman Maddux instructed you to deliver the application to Pamela Brown for notarization.
6. Councilman Maddux instructed you to file and/or accept the application.
7. Councilman Maddux's application was signed but was not notarized when you retrieved it.
8. You provided Councilman Maddux's application to Pamela Brown.
9. Councilman Maddux did not personally appear before Pamela Brown and swear to Exhibit A.
10. Exhibit B, Pages 1 and 2 represent a true and correct copy of directions you created and/or approved for candidates applying for public office in the 2024 City of Conroe General Election and posted on the City of Conroe website further accompanied by a blank ballot application and associated instructions promulgated by the Texas Secretary of State, located at the following City of Conroe URL address:





## NEPOTISM LAW

The candidate must sign this statement indicating his awareness of the nepotism law. When a candidate signs the application, it is an acknowledgment that the candidate is aware of the nepotism law. The nepotism prohibitions of chapter 573, Government Code, are summarized below:

No officer may appoint, or vote for or confirm the appointment or employment of any person related within the second degree by affinity (marriage) or the third degree by consanguinity (blood) to the officer, or to any other member of the governing body or court on which the officer serves when the compensation of that person is to be paid out of public funds or fees of office. However, nothing in the law prevents the appointment, voting for, or confirmation of anyone who has been continuously employed in the office or employment for the following period prior to the election or appointment of the officer or member related to the employee in the prohibited degree: six months, if the officer or member is elected at an election other than the general election for state and county officers.

No candidate may take action to influence an employee of the office to which the candidate is seeking election or an employee or officer of the governmental body to which the candidate is seeking election regarding the appointment or employment of a person related to the candidate in a prohibited degree as noted above. This prohibition does not apply to a candidate's actions with respect to a bona fide class or category of employees or prospective employees.

## LEY DE NEPOTISMO

El candidato debe firmar esta declaración indicando su conocimiento de la ley del nepotismo. Cuando un candidato firma la solicitud, es un reconocimiento de que el candidato conoce la ley del nepotismo. Las prohibiciones de nepotismo del capítulo 573, Código de Gobierno, se resumen a continuación:

Ningún funcionario puede nombrar, votar o confirmar el nombramiento o empleo de cualquier persona emparentada dentro del segundo grado por afinidad (matrimonio) o del tercer grado por consanguinidad (sangre) con sí mismo, o con cualquier otro miembro del órgano de gobierno o corte en el que se desempeña cuando la compensación de esa persona debe pagarse con fondos públicos o honorarios del cargo. Sin embargo, nada en la ley impide el nombramiento, la votación o la confirmación de cualquier persona que haya estado empleada continuamente en la oficina o el empleo durante el período siguiente antes de la elección o el nombramiento del funcionario o miembro emparentado con el empleado en el grado prohibido: seis meses, si el funcionario o miembro es elegido en una elección que no sea la elección general para funcionarios estatales y del condado.

Ningún candidato puede tomar medidas para influir en un empleado del cargo al que aspira a ser elegido o en un empleado o funcionario del organismo gubernamental al que aspira a ser elegido en relación con el nombramiento o el empleo de una persona emparentada con el candidato en un grado prohibido, tal como se ha indicado anteriormente. Esta prohibición no se aplica a las acciones de un candidato con respecto a una clase o categoría de buena fe de empleados o empleados prospectos.
