I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

It is altogether fitting and proper that this request is submitted during the Memorial Day remembrance, the day we honor those who lost their lives while in service to the United States during peace and war. We honor the men and women who gave their life to preserve the freedom, liberties, and protections guaranteed to the citizens by our U.S. Constitution, all Federal and State statutes, including the statutes and codes cited in this request for remedy and relief.

We provide this executive summary so the SOAH ALJs may clearly understand why we submit this motion and what relief is required:

- A.** The Applicants did not comply with 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a) and did not fully provide required public notice, public meetings, or proof of notice.
- B.** After the initial public meetings, the Applicants more than tripled the length of preliminary routes impacting Lampasas County landowners and more than doubled the length of preliminary routes links impacting McCulloch and San Saba County landowners. Applicants added 400 miles of new route links, impacting over 1,300 subsequently affected landowners, without notice to, or any input from, these newly affected landowners.
- C.** The Applicants did not properly obtain current county tax rolls at the time of required notice for application but rather obtained and/or used outdated tax rolls.
- D.** By using outdated tax rolls, the Applicants failed to send notice to all current landowners as required by 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a).(3), including David and Amy Hillock.
- E.** David Hillock contacted the Applicants, Jerry McConnell, by telephone on April 10, 2026, and informed the Applicants he owned directly affected property and had not been notified. Applicants' April 15, Affidavit of Notice (59475-542) makes no mention of the Hillocks.
- F.** These Aggrieved Landowners are owed a day-for-day, 206-day extension as relief, in accordance with 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a).(5).
- G.** PURA § 37.057 and 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a) are harmonized by the legislation.

II. BACKGROUND

A. The intent of these SOAH proceedings:

The intent of these SOAH proceedings is to ensure all landowners have been properly notified, are afforded due process, and are allowed to fully vet the Applicants' proposed project, in fulfillment of the ALJs SOAH Order No.1 call to duty.

B. Legislative intent of Public Utility Regulatory Act ("PURA"):

PURA was adopted in 1997 and the legislative intent of the Act, which is to protect the public from the utility companies, is clearly and unambiguously stated in its general provisions, PURA § 11.002 Purpose and Findings:

“(a) This title is enacted to protect the public interest inherent in the rates and services of public utilities. The purpose of this title is to establish a comprehensive and adequate regulatory system for public utilities to assure rates, operations, and services that are just and reasonable to the consumers and to the utilities.

(b) Public utilities traditionally are by definition monopolies in the areas they serve. As a result, the normal forces of competition that regulate prices in a free enterprise society do not operate. Public agencies regulate utility rates, operations, and services as a substitute for competition.”

Every interpretation and/or application of any section of PURA made by the SOAH ALJs must be judged in the context of that legislative intent and must err on the side of the landowners and public interest and must not favor the interests of the Applicants or arbitrary expediency.

C. Legislative intent of PURA § 37.057:

The intent of PURA § 37.057 is to speed the typical review process for average applications for certificate of convenience and necessity (“CCN”), while providing a built-in

relief valve to address the additional time necessary for overly complex or controversial CCNs.

Every interpretation and/or application of any sections of PURA, made by the SOAH ALJs or the Commission must be judged in the context of that legislative intent described above and must err on the side of the landowners and public interest, and must not favor the interests of the Applicants or arbitrary expediency, including PURA § 37.057.

Regarding the PURA § 37.057 180-day deadline, Commissioner Gleeson committed in testimony during the April 1, 2026, Texas Senate Committee on Business and Commerce hearing that:

- A. *“We are never going to sacrifice figuring out what is in the public interest in making the right decision for expediency, so **I view the 180 days as a signal** from the legislature that they, that you all, would like us to get this done as quickly as possible, but we are **never going to make a decision that is not fully informed just to meet a 180- day timeline.**”*

Further, in recent PUC Docket 57648 the application for CCN was filed on February 19, 2025. That docket took 230 days to reach an initial Commission decision and the world kept turning. The consequential issues in that case were not as blatantly obvious, as negative, or as widespread as those in this case

D. HB 5066(88) was arbitrary and capricious:

In 2023, the 88th Legislature enacted HB 5066(88) (“5066”) which reduced the previous timeframe from one-year to 180 days for the Commission to deny or grant an application for CCN in PURA § 37.057. The 180-day deadline established by 5066 is arbitrary and capricious. 5066 did not make any allowance for the dramatic reduction in review time. It did not require

any preliminary work by the utilities prior to submission of the application. 5066 made absolutely no provision to assure the public was protected in any manner from the obvious potential impacts of the arbitrary and capricious reduction in review time. Those impacts to the public, and in particular affected landowners, are glaring and obvious to even the most casual observer of 59475 and its current procedural schedule.

E. Intent of 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52:

The intent of 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52 is to ensure a robust public engagement process that requires an applicant to provide ALL affected landowners with advance notice and opportunity to attend a public meeting, via a direct mailed invitation, on all applications for CCNs, unless the CCN is very small and affects less than 25 landowners.

The 22.52 requirements are so important in protecting the public that 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a).(4) requires certification of whether or not the Applicants have coordination with all landowners, requiring an affidavit with *“a statement of whether any formal contact related to the proceeding between THE utility and THE landowner other than the [application] notice has occurred.”*

16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a).(4) requires hearty public outreach and it requires the Applicants to certify for coordination with each and every landowner, not just some broad, blanket statement that they talked to a few folks, thus the code states “THE landowner” not general “landowners”.

The Applicant did not provide these individual statements of certification because they did not perform the required robust public outreach or the required public meetings for a very large number and percentage of affected property owners.

F. There is perfect harmony between PURA 37.057 and 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a):

There is perfect harmony and no conflict between PURA 37.057 and 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a). The legislation provided PURA § 37.057 with a self-healing remedy expressly for the anticipated future inability of the Commission to always meet the deadline to approve or deny an application for CCN. PURA § 37.057 provides protection for the public, when longer review timeframes are necessary, as is the case here for 59475, while also providing all parties protection by directing that they may seek relief in a Travis County Court.

If the ALJs endorse the Applicants' actions here, it would be a devastating precedent to set. The ALJs might as well strike all requirements in the codes for public involvement and notice because of the result would be SOAH approval to game the system at egregious scales.

G. Applicants did not notify landowners along 400 miles of preliminary routes that their property was affected:

Prior to filing their March 26, 2026 CCN application, the Applicants did not notify all affected landowners of the project or provide them the opportunity to attend a public meeting or allow them to submit public comments regarding the details of their property or their community values, as required by 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a).(4). These landowners, who were not afforded opportunity for a public meeting, are situated on approximately 400 miles of added route links which impacted about 2,000 owners of approximately 1,300 to 1,400 affected properties that were within 500 feet of the centerline of the Applicants' transmission project.

H. A map is worth one-thousand words:

A map is worth one thousand words. Look at Attachment 1, a map depicting the route links presented by the Applicants at their only round of public meetings in June 2025 compared to the mass of route links added after the public meetings, which denied likely 2,000 directly affected landowners of due process. **More than 60% of the total route link lengths in both McCulloch and San Saba Counties are these "new" route links where the landowners were not**

notified or afforded opportunity for a public meeting and public input before the Applicants finalized and submitted their application. **Lampasas County is even worse with about 70%** of total route link length without notice or community value or other input opportunity. **Bell County** has about **30%** of the total route link length without public meeting or public input.

I. Applicants' own route analysis describes the critical and consequential purpose and the significance of public outreach:

The Applicants' Environmental Assessment, Section 5.2 - Public Participation Meeting Comments, provides a 10-page summary of public comments gathered during and after the public meetings, by those who were notified. As evidence of the importance and strength of the public input that came from the public meetings, Applicants used this public input to remove 100 miles of initial route links and add 400 miles of new route links. The Aggrieved Landowners were never afforded the opportunity to participate, their community values were not considered, their concerns were not addressed. As a result, the Aggrieved Landowners may likely directly bear a significant portion of the project's impacts expressly because of the Applicants' failure to notify and subsequent denial of their rights of due process.

Below is further evidence of what has been taken from the Aggrieved Landowners. This section is copied from the Applicants' Environmental Assessment and Alternative Route Analysis (p. 2-9):

The purpose of the public participation meetings was to:

- Solicit comments and input from residents, landowners, public officials, and other interested parties concerning the proposed project, preliminary alternative route links, and the overall transmission line routing process;
- Promote a better understanding of the proposed project, including the need, purpose, potential benefits, potential impacts, and the CCN certification process;
- Inform the public regarding the anticipated project schedule and the decision-making process; and
- Identify the values and concerns of the public and community leaders.

J. Applicants did not properly obtain and utilize the current county tax rolls for notification of application:

The Applicants did not “*on the date it files an application, mail notice of its application to the owners of land, as stated on the CURRENT county tax rolls, who would be directly affected by the requested certificate.*” as required by 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a).(3).

Applicants used addresses from outdated and/or old tax rolls that were NOT CURRENT and therefore excluded required notification of property owners who had owned their property since 2025 and who were listed on the then current county tax rolls in late March 2026. The full extent and ramification of this omission is not known at this time, but it is most likely more than just David and Amy Hillock.

K. PURA and TAC are structured to grant the Aggrieved Landowners relief:

The owners of the 1,300 to 1,400 properties who were not properly notified of the project, afforded an opportunity for a public meeting, or given opportunity to provide public comment regarding their community values or details of their property during the preliminary route evaluation phase, require day-for-day remedy and relief, in accordance with 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a).(5). This motion is brought and signed by 179 of those affected property owners.

L. PURA and TAC are structured to grant David and Amy Hillock relief:

David and Amy Hillock bought their property, identified by Applicants as Tract 1796.9, on November 3, 2025 and the deed was filed with the Burnet County Clerk on November 7, 2025. Burnet Central Appraisal District receives property ownership updates from the Burnet County Clerk daily and in turn, updates the Burnet County tax rolls in a continuous and expeditious manner. The Applicants did not properly notify the Hillocks of the filing of the application for CCN because the Applicants did not properly collect current county tax rolls for use in their March 26, 2026, notification mailings, as required by 16 Tex. Admin. Code §

22.52.(a).(3). As such, David and Amy Hillock require day-for-day remedy and relief, in accordance with 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a).(5).

M. PBRP states 59475, and all of Import Path 2, is not needed until 2038:

ERCOT's PBRP (55718-17) of July 25, 2024, and ERCOT's Sequencing Letter (55718-53) of December 12, 2024, both indicate Import Path 2 in its entirety, is not "needed" until 2038. At the Commission's October 24, 2024, open meeting, Commissioner Hjaltman requested that ERCOT provide information regarding the recommended sequencing of the transmission projects in the Permian Basin Reliability Plan. The December 12, 2024, ERCOT Sequencing Letter was written by ERCOT Vice President Katie Hobbs in direct response to that request.

In Ms. Hobbs' Sequencing Letter:

Ms. Hobbs wrote, *"ERCOT suggests that the sequencing of CCN applications should be guided by several general principles. First, as Staff's memorandum proposes, ERCOT recommends that projects needed to serve the forecasted 2030 load in the Permian Basin Region should be prioritized over projects needed to serve the 2038 load."*. She stated ERCOT agreed with staff that Import Path 2 should not be prioritized. She also states in her Sequencing Letter, *"Two of the four 345-kV import paths and two of the three 765-kV import paths are needed by 2030."*.

In the Sequencing Letter, Ms. Hobbs goes on to say *"I hope you find the preceding information helpful to the Commission's purposes. I plan to be available at your December 19, 2024 open meeting to answer any questions you may have."* It is important to note that the same Ms. Hobbs submitted ERCOT's 2024 Regional Transmission Plan ("2024-RTP") to the Commission on December 20, 2024.

On December 19, 2024, the day before submitting the 2024-RTP, and as she had indicated, Ms. Hobbs spoke at the PUC Commission open meeting and made no reference to any changes in ERCOT modeling results with respect to Import Path 2's 2038 year of need

As shown in ERCOT's PBRP, which is the sole basis provided by the Applicants for the project need, it is Import Path 2 that is not needed until 2038, so there is absolutely no reason the ALJs should give any consideration or weight to the 180-day deadline, relative to the requirement to notify affected landowners and protect property rights and rights of due process. PURA § 37.057 has its own, built in relief mechanism, as provided by the legislature who rightly foresaw that complex scenarios, such as this one, would arise.

III. ARGUMENT

A. The Applicants bear all responsibility:

Every issue of negative consequences described below appear to be a direct result of the Applicants' willful actions or their deliberate choice of inaction, with each causing the public to solely suffer numerous resulting detriments and damages.

B. Applicants appear to have willfully chosen not to comply with 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a).(4):

The Applicants had ample time, experience, and resources to notify the 1,300 to 1,400 affected landowners of the proposed project in the late summer or early fall of 2025, but they chose not to. They could have easily sent notices and held additional public meetings, but they chose not to. The Applicants could have easily routinely updated their online route link mapping applications to indicate to the public all new routes under consideration, but they chose not to.

Maybe they thought it would be too much trouble to inform these 1,300 to 1,400 affected landowners of the impending doom, but for whatever reason, they willfully chose secrecy. They willfully denied landowners access to important preliminary route location information.

Attachments 2 and 3 contain a copy of a February 16, 2026, email exchange between Kevin Kennedy and LRCA TSC representatives where Mr. Kennedy asks for the mapping files showing all routes segment links under consideration on that date. He explained the public's need to know and the need for transparency. LCRA TSC refused the request, knowing full well the negative ramifications to the public. The same individuals that refused that request for transparency will argue against this motion and the public protections clearly required by the statutes and codes.

Additionally, the Applicants did not properly collect and utilized current county tax rolls to develop the mailing list for their March 26, 2026, application notifications, as required by 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a).(3).

C. Applicants claim of “over-inclusion” is offensive:

The public's community values and the constraint data collected by the Applicants was woefully under-sampled due to the Applicants' failure to adhere to 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a).(3) and (4). Their study results are flawed by their lack of due diligence, inadequate opportunity for public input and utilization of underrepresented data. The Applicants have the audacity to boast in their application (p. 29) that the public meeting “*notice to property owners was intentionally over-inclusive*”. No statement could be further from the truth.

D. Remedy and relief granted in 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52 for the Applicants' failure to comply:

16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a).(5) requires that at a minimum: “*Failure to provide notice in accordance with this section will be cause for day-for-day extension of deadlines for intervention and for commission action on the application.*”. The day-for-day extension owed to the landowners who were not notified and who were denied due process is the amount of time between the date when the landowners should have been informed and the date when they were, or will be, eventually informed.

E. Applicants will likely claim they “technically” complied with 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a).(4):

The Applicants will likely argue they technically complied and exceeded 16 TAC 22.52.(a).(4) requirements regarding public meetings. They will state that at least one public meeting is required but they conducted three public meetings in June of 2025. However, such an argument ignores the broader intent and purpose of the governing rule, 16 TAC 22.52. The requirement “at least one public meeting” cannot be read in isolation or reduced to a mere procedural checkbox. When 16 TAC 22.52 is read as a whole, it is clear the intent of the regulatory framework is to ensure meaningful notice and participation by ALL affected landowners throughout the analysis of routing and the route decision-making process.

Compliance with the spirit and purpose of these requirements is especially critical in a project of this magnitude involving hundreds of miles of proposed transmission infrastructure, including approximately 400 miles of newly added route segments and alternatives introduced after the public meetings. It was from public input at these public meetings, as stated in the Applicants Environmental Assessment, that 400 miles of new route links and the 1,300 to 1,400 affected landowners were born. To deny such a large number of landowners the opportunity to participate early in the process, evaluate routes, retain experts or counsel, and provide meaningful input before route development is finalized, is exactly opposite of what the statutes and TAC require. Complete relief must be granted.

Under these circumstances, and if the Applicants attempt to make the anticipated argument that the simple act of conducting a public meeting somehow satisfies the intent of the 16 TAC 22.52.(a).(4), it should be viewed by the Administrative Law Judges as an argument without merit.

The applicant had ample time and resources to ensure ALL newly affected landowners within 500' of the proposed transmission lines were notified and informed. Proper notification

became even more critical since the Applicants identified Route 894 as the best meets route, which included over 150 Aggrieved Landowners, who were never afforded an opportunity for a public meeting, were not permitted to provide input or allowed to participate at all during the alternative route development stage, even though 16 TAC 22.52.(a).(4) requires notification if over 25 landowners are affected by ANY routes under consideration, let alone the best meets route.

F. Applicants may argue not all Aggrieved Landowners are intervenors:

The Applicants may argue that not all of the Aggrieved Landowners are intervenors; that argument will be without merit. The number of Aggrieved Landowners far exceeds the 25-landowner threshold for public meeting notice per 16 TAC 22.52.(a).(4). Also, such an argument would only bolster the position of the Aggrieved Landowners because it is the Applicants' failure to notify that denied the Aggrieved Landowners a fair and reasonable opportunity to adequately prepare for the rigors of contesting a PUC CCN case. Had they been given notice and time, there would likely be many, many more intervenors from within the 1,300 to 1,400 affected landowners. With our limited resources, this is all we were able to contact on such an abbreviated schedule. In basically only one week, we have found 179 aligned Aggrieved Landowners who make this motion. With proper notice, that number would increase greatly.

G. 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a) is not in conflict with PURA § 37.057:

16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a) and PURA § 37.057 are in perfect harmony. 37.057 was written, with the legislative intent to automatically provide remedy and opportunity for relief if a particular CCN application is too complex or controversial and the Commission cannot approve or deny it within the arbitrary 180-day deadline established for all CCN applications, no matter how small or large they may be. 59475 is obviously one of the largest and most contested

CCNs in PUC history and therefore everyone should anticipate and expect it cannot, will not, be decided in 180 days.

The original 1997 legislation that adopted the Texas Utility Code recognized that from time to time a CCN application would not be able to be properly reviewed in the allotted timeframe and so it provided a built-in remedy. 37.057 states: *"If the commission does not approve or deny the application on or before that date, a party may seek a writ of mandamus in a district court of Travis County to compel the commission to decide on the application."* Almost thirty years later that language and that remedy remain unchanged. This built-in remedy is what keeps 22.52 and 37.057 in harmony and eliminates any conflict.

1 Tex. Admin. Code § 155.3(b):

"If there is a conflict between an agency's rules or prior decisions and statutory provisions applicable to the case, and the rules or decisions CANNOT be harmonized with the statute, the statute controls."

The operative portion of 1 Tex. Admin. Code § 155.3(b) is *"the rules or decisions cannot be harmonized with the statute"*. 22.52 and 37.057 are in harmony and not in conflict.

Here we have a highly controversial transmission expansion plan, questionable load forecasts and "need", unparalleled scope and scale of projects, unprecedented procedural challenges, egregious acts requiring remedy and relief, etc. any of which alone could require more than 180-days to properly address. In 59475 we have all these combined and a pending CCN application that would destroy thousands of acres of our precious Texas Hill Country. If there ever will be a case for the SOAH ALJs to acknowledge that you cannot always stuff ten pounds of junk into a one-pound box, 59475 is clearly it. The public interest is currently being sacrificed at the 180-day altar. PURA's legislative intent and enacted purpose are being disregarded; it should clearly be the other way around.

April 1, 2026, commitments made by Commissioner Gleeson at the Senate Committee on Business and Commerce hearing that “We are never going to sacrifice figuring out what is in the public interest in making the right decision for expediency” and “we are never going to make a decision that is not fully informed just to meet a 180- day timeline.” are tremendously significant, in light of the unprecedented actions taken against the public thus far in 59475.

H. Inability to meet 37.057 is the fault of Applicants, not the landowners:

The reason the Commission cannot approve or deny 59475 within 37.057’s 180-day deadline is wholly the fault of the Applicants. The Applicants chose not to comply with 22.52 before they filed their application, which started the 180-day clock. They could have waited to file the application, adhered to 22.52, and notified all the affected landowners on the links they added after the June 2025 public meetings. They could have held additional public meetings, as required by 22.52, but they appeared to have made the willful decision not to do that. The Applicants could have properly collected current county tax rolls. They seem to have chosen to make their efforts easier, to the detriment of landowners, by not complying with 22.52.(a). The Applicants prematurely submitted a deficient application and the landowners who did not receive the required notifications and public meetings must be granted day-for-day relief. The Applicants caused this unprecedented breach of the public trust; the Applicants are at fault, not the public.

I. Numerous impacts on the affected landowners of the Applicants’ failure to comply with 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52:

By the Applicants appearing to ignore the obvious intent of 16 TAC § 22.52.(a).(4), these Aggrieved Landowners were given no opportunity to learn about the project, no opportunity to attend a public meeting, no opportunity to weigh in on community values, no opportunity to submit comments, no opportunity to describe their property and its features, no opportunity to get PUC experienced legal representation, no opportunity to coordinate with neighbors, no opportunity to protect their families, no opportunity to defend their legacies. This is why 16 Tex.

Admin. Code § 22.52 exists in the code and why you must grant these Aggrieved Landowners the relief due to them.

J. Applicants' errors and omissions were not minor route adjustments:

This was not some minor route adjustment or isolated incident that can be swept under the rug. The majority of affected property owners in Bell, Lampasas, McCulloch and San Saba have been aggrieved, and they require their due relief from the State and ALJs.

K. Applicants did not provide a complete certification of notice:

The Applicants did not comply with the requirements of 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a).(3).(E) Proof of notice, which requires the Applicants to provide an affidavit which *"must include a list of all landowners to whom notice [of application] was sent and a statement of whether any formal contact related to the proceeding between THE utility and THE landowner other than the [application] notice has occurred."* The term "the landowner" is singular. 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a).(3).(E) requires the Applicants certify whether or not they gave notice and opportunity for a public meeting and comment before the application was filed, to each and every individual landowner, as required by 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a).(4). 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52.(a).(3).(E) requires full disclosure by the Applicants, in keeping with the legislative purpose of the PURA, which is to ensure the public is protected from the utility companies.

The Applicants should have disclosed in the affidavit that they did not notice or allow public participation before the application for 1,300 to 1,400 affected landowners. They should have disclosed that they did not use current county tax rolls to create their mailing list for notification of application. That is the purpose for the proof of notice; 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52(a) requires robust public outreach and it requires the Applicants provide proof they complied; the Applicants did neither.

L. Direct consequences and tragic example of Applicants failure to properly notify:

To many observers it could appear that the Applicants attempted to game the system, in what was a most despicable and offensive manner. John and Susan Burrow, and their family, and Erik and Ashely Gulbranson, and their family, are directly impacted by G73. Below is just how dire their plight is:

The Burrow's and Gulbranson's have been harmed and this motion will provide partial remedy and relief:

- Only about two-thirds of 59475 impacted property owners were notified in June 2025, and afforded an opportunity to have any input during the crucial route evaluation phase.
- Route link G73 was added by the Applicants after the public meeting, probably July – September 2025, and more than six months before the Burrows and Gulbransons knew anything of the proposed project.
- The Applicants kept any public knowledge of the addition of G73 secret.
- G73 impacted property owners were caught flat-footed when they finally received notice in April 2026, caused by the deliberate concealment of the G73 addition by the Applicants.
- G73 impacted property owners cannot find experienced legal representation because every PUC lawyer has been long since taken.
- G73 impacted property owners are completely powerless to do much of anything and must almost daily fight the Applicants who use their great resources to battle constantly to have landowner intervenors removed, limit discovery, and to have landowner testimony stricken.

- If landowners have a duty to intervene, the ALJs have a duty to enforce notification requirements.

The worst circumstances of all:

- Route G73 is on the Applicants' Best Meets Route 894
- Route G73 is on all six of the Applicants' Top Six Routes
- Route G73 is on twenty-seven of the Applicants' Top Thirty Routes
- Route G73 is on 92 of the 122 routes in the Applicants' application

It appears, the Applicants may possibly have purposely withheld notification from these many, many property owners, though they knew, or should have reasonably known, it was highly likely these landowners would be impacted by the final route. (See Attachment Nos. 1, 2 and 3).

The Gulbranson's have four children, who are home-schooled. Their home is a school. Their home school is Habitable Structure #296. The Applicants placed the centerline of the 765-kV line 245 feet from their home where Mom, Dad, and four children are almost 24 / 7. The near 765-kV wire will be only about 180 feet from their house. Can you imagine what these fine people face and their inability to marshal any type of defense given the concealment of G73 and subsequent lack of proper notification?

M. ALJs must require Applicants to determine all non-notified landowners:

The ALJs must compel the Applicants to determine all affected landowners who were in the current County tax rolls when the application was submitted on March 26, 2026, but who were not in the outdated tax rolls used by the Applicants to notify the public of the application. Even if the Applicants may argue they acquired appraisal district ownership data, they did not ensure they obtained the current tax rolls. There may exist multiple county tax roll data sets but only one will be current; therefore, such an argument would be without merit. All those currently unknown affected landowners must be identified, notified, and granted day-for-day relief.

N. The current procedural schedule is insufficient to properly adjudicate this case:

The extraordinary speed at which these proceedings are being forced forward has already been acknowledged by the SOAH ALJs presiding over the companion Import Route 3 proceedings, PUC Docket 59336. In the 59336 pre-hearing, they said the schedule is not normal, and that the case was moving really, really aggressively fast. They also said that it is one of the biggest cases that has ever come through SOAH and it was subjected to a deadline that put all under extraordinarily intense time pressure. At times they seemed to joke about their restrictive procedures, which are no joking matter to the thousands of affected landowners.

The 59336 ALJs said they know other parties are all juggling a whole lot and that they don't think these SOAH hearings are going to be the end of the matter, but they had a job to do. They said, we are going to do our job next week and we have teed ourselves up, as best we can, to get it done expeditiously. The 59336 ALJs further acknowledged that they had not had sufficient time to review testimony, because of the overwhelming demands and compressed schedule imposed upon all parties. These are the exact same ALJs who set and control the 59336 procedural schedule. Those ALJs willfully established an impossible procedural schedule.

Those statements demonstrate the unreasonable pace and procedural strain surrounding the proceedings. It shows the 59336 ALJs priority is to meet arbitrary deadlines rather than to conduct a hearing of appropriate duration, necessary to sufficiently determine the merits of the application or the negative impacts to the public. Despite the unprecedented complexity, magnitude, and long-term impacts of 59336, it appears the consensus of the 59336 ALJs was to limit parties only a few minutes of testimony and examination of evidence, concerns, and critical facts regarding project need and impacts to homes, businesses, agricultural operations, schools, as well as private property rights in general.

Such limitations are unreasonable and fundamentally inconsistent with the PUC's obligation to develop a complete and reliable evidentiary record upon which sound decisions can be made. A similar potential situation here in 59475, is made even more troubling when you consider the Applicants' exclusion of notice and input from 1,300 to 1,400 affected landowners, were never notified of the June 2025 public meetings. They were deprived of meaningful opportunities to participate during the earliest and most important stages of the route development process. **The Commission cannot reasonably expect the public to provide the critical information necessary for informed decision-making while simultaneously compressing timelines, restricting testimony, and failing to ensure proper notice to a substantial number of affected landowners, including a majority of landowners in three Counties.**

O. SOAH ALJs cannot ignore or set aside the remedy and relief guaranteed in the 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52 administrative rule:

The administrative rules in question are not in conflict with the PURA statutes, in fact, 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52 is in harmony with PURA § 37.057, because 37.057 anticipated not all CCN applications could be adequately reviewed in 180 days, so it provides its own remedy. 22.52 works within the framework of 37.057 and provides the public the protections established by PURA while also allowing the Applicants with the opportunity to seek relief in a Travis County Court, if they choose. As such, no action is required of SOAH regarding any failure to meet the 180-day deadline; such a possibility is already accounted for and built into the statutes.

P. Appropriate beginning date for the day-for-day relief for the 1,300-1,400 landowners who were not afforded an opportunity for a public meeting or to give public input:

Maximum number of days: 300 days

The Applicants mailed notices in advance of the public meetings, which were held on June 16-18, 2025. They mailed notices of application on March 26, 2026.

The resulting maximum reasonable day-for-day extension would be about 300 days.

Minimum number of days: 170 days

We know through RFIs to the Applicants that they officially named Route Link E6 on October 24, 2025, which would have been one of their last actions regarding the route analysis process. We also know through another RFI that they collected aerial imagery on the routes from October 6-8, 2025, so they had to know the route locations at that point.

They mailed notices of application on March 26, 2026. The resulting minimum possible day-for-day extension would be 170 days.

Best number of days for day-to-day extension: 206 days

We have multiple RFIs that have not yet been answered, which should help tie down the best date for which to base the day-for-day relief. Though we do not have that information yet, we expect most additional route links may have been identified primarily in July and August, so September 1 may be a good happy medium.

From September 1, 2025, to March 26, 2026, is 206 days relief for the 1,300-1,400 disenfranchised property owners.

Q. Appropriate day-for-day relief for David and Amy Hillock:

David and Any Hillock have not yet been notified by the Applicants and have not received their required notice and packet with maps, so their clock is still running. Let us assume the Applicants will be able to mail the required notice by Friday, May 29, 2026.

From March 26, 2026, to May 29, 2026, is 64 days relief for David and Amy Hillock.

IV. PRAYER

We, the Aggrieved Landowners, respectfully request the following:

- Request an immediate extension of all elements of the 59475 and 59182 procedural schedules for 206 days for owners of the 1,300 to 1,400 affected properties.
- Request an immediate extension of all elements of the 59475 and 59182 procedural schedules for 64 days based on failure to notify David and Any Hillock of the filing of the application, including the hearing on merits.
- Request that the two extensions run concurrently.
- Request the ALJs compel the Applicants to obtain truly current county tax rolls and provide all parties with a list of all landowners who were not properly notified of the application due to the Applicants use of outdated county tax rolls.
- Request the ALJs compel the Applicants to immediately and properly notify all non-notified landowners, as identified above, and that the ALJs provide those landowners their due day-for-day extensions of the 59475 and 59182 procedural schedules.
- Time is of the essence, so we request that ALJs grant an interlocutory continuance while you contemplate this consequential decision and that you pause the entire procedural schedules 59182 and 59475 until the motion is either granted by you, the SOAH ALJs, or after we Aggrieved Landowners have three days to submit an appeal to the Commission, and the Commission has had an opportunity to rule on the appeal. The hearing on merits should not be conducted until the multitude of Aggrieved Landowners, and David and Any Hillock, are granted remedy and full relief.
- We request that you grant such other and further relief to which the Aggrieved Landowners may be justly entitled.
- Lastly, we request you take such actions as may be appropriate against the Applicants given the scale, costs and impacts of the apparent transgressions.

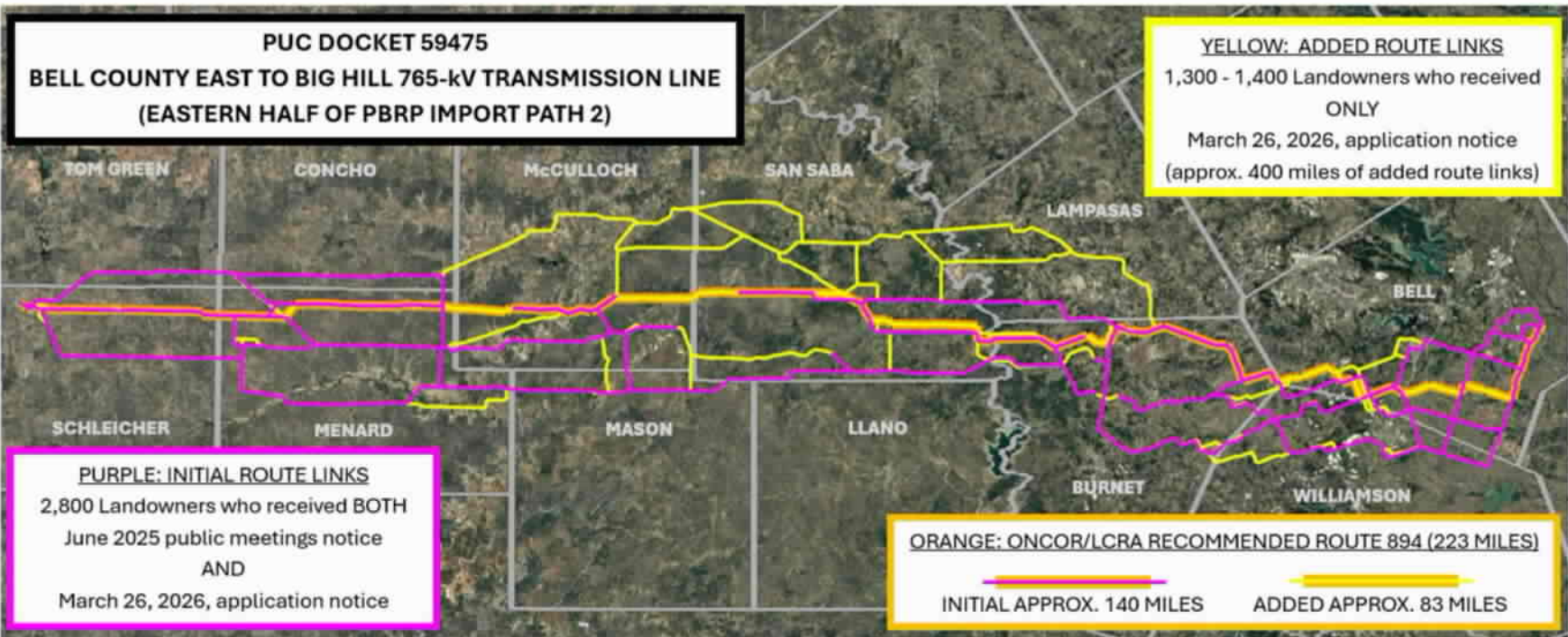

I am sure your engineers and environmentalists have already found, through their desktop review, that proposed Route Segment G4 of your Bell County East Switch to Big Hill Substation 765-kV Transmission Project (BCE-BH) is a less-than-ideal location to site a 765kV transmission line. They should already know of the challenging impacts stemming from a route that not only crosses back and forth but tracks along the main channel and floodplain of the North San Gabriel River and its major tributary, the Russell Fork, for miles and miles.

What they may not know is the rich history of the people who settled along these life-giving waters, and whose descendants still own many of the important and historic ranches that those settler families carved from the wild. The NRHP Assessment will provide some insight to this largely undocumented community. Much work is still needed to find and document the many, many important remaining structures and other works of these early Texans, who relied on the good water from these rivers.

As an example, I have over two miles of historic rock fence on my ranch alone. These relatively uncommon rock fences were only constructed near the river itself, encircling the small fields of prime and unique farmland that were worthy of such a herculean effort to protect growing crops from loose, roaming livestock. The weak soil grasslands, which were predominant everywhere but in the actual bottomland floodplains, were left as open range until barbed wire came on the scene. Being an area of Anglo settlement, our rock fences differ from those of the German settlements of Gillespie County, etc.

I wanted to put this assessment in your hands so you might have an opportunity to review it before our meeting. You will see in the report, people came to this river bottom and generations of descendants never left, even though many are the epitome of being land-rich and cash-poor, they keep the land and the ranching traditions. They should already know of the challenging impacts stemming from a route that not only crosses back and forth but tracks along the main channel and floodplain of the North San Gabriel River and its major tributary, the Russell Fork, for miles and miles.
