Robert,

You may attribute the statement below either to Oncor or to me as Oncor spokesperson.

*Oncor and LCRA TSC complied with all state laws and regulations when providing landowner notice for this project, and in several ways exceeded those requirements. In June 2025, we advertised the project's multiple upcoming public meetings – triple the amount required – in numerous local newspapers ([listed here](#)), going beyond state notification rules to help ensure communities were broadly informed about the project, **preliminary** routes, and the opportunity to engage with our teams.*

*After filing this project's CCN application on March 26, 2026, we mailed notice via first-class mail to all property owners within 520 feet of the formally proposed routes. This is the notice required by 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52. Again, our notification efforts exceeded state requirements. We mailed more than 4,200 total notices after filing the CCN application, and more than 1,200 of those notices were mailed despite not being required by 16 Tex. Admin. Code § 22.52. The administrative law judges presiding over this project have already concluded that we [properly followed the law](#).*

*It is typical for preliminary routing options to evolve as additional information is gathered. Following the summer 2025 public meetings, several preliminary routes were added, modified, and removed in response to the feedback we received at those meetings. These changes are detailed in Section 6.0 of the Environmental Assessment and Alternative Route Analysis included in the CCN application. The CCN filing is the point at which **formally proposed routes** are set and formal notifications are issued. While some residents participated earlier in the **preliminary** engagement process, **the formal opportunity to intervene in the CCN proceeding was the same for all impacted individuals**. All landowners identified at filing received the same mailed notice, project information, and opportunity to intervene.*

*See attached for copies of the mailed notices. They include all required elements, including project descriptions, maps of the preliminary or proposed routes, instructions for intervention, and contact information for Oncor, LCRA TSC and the PUCT.*
