I believe my issue is outside of the Statutory Complaint process. It concerns [REDACTED] students who are being forced to take the Covid vaccination in order to graduate. The current statutes prohibit employees from mandating this vaccine and also provide for exemptions for students. However, while performing [REDACTED], some medical institutions are requiring students to take the vaccine. In this situation, the students are not employees and it is not the school requiring the vaccine, thus the institution is apparently within their legal right to require the vaccination (though it certainly defies the spirit of the law). I am [REDACTED], which is my top choice. But I also have not received — and do not plan to receive — the COVID vaccine. Under Texas law, that should not be a barrier: public universities are prohibited from requiring the vaccine for students. And likewise, Texas employers also cannot mandate the vaccine as a condition of employment, even for [REDACTED]. However, [REDACTED] has informed me that the [REDACTED] —where all [REDACTED] students must complete a mandatory [REDACTED] —requires students doing [REDACTED] at the facility to be vaccinated for COVID. If I don't get the vaccine, I won't be allowed to complete [REDACTED]. And without it, I cannot graduate. I've also been told that my credits will not transfer, meaning I could complete years of coursework only to end up unable to earn my degree. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] I have a recording of the personnel at student affairs attesting to this policy. This requirement—which forces [REDACTED] students to get a vaccine that even the licensed [REDACTED] working beside them aren't required to have—seems to be contrary to (at minimum) the intent of the state law. Texas law protects both students and employees. If the [REDACTED] is asserting that these students fall into some third category such that they are neither protected as students nor as employees, then this is a loophole large enough to defeat the very protections the Legislature enacted. This creates a barrier to entry into the [REDACTED] profession that Texas lawmakers explicitly sought to prevent.

If you have any contacts in government who can clarify that UT cannot require a [REDACTED] that mandates the COVID vaccine—or that [REDACTED] cannot require individuals doing [REDACTED]

with the Center to get the COVID vaccine—I'd greatly appreciate it. I also believe that this issue needs attention at a higher level: unless addressed, it will continue to undermine both students' rights and the state's clear policy choices.

Texas State University is willfully failing to comply with HB1027. Texas HB 1027 is codified as Texas Education Code § 51.4521. HB 1027 aims to ensure students are not forced into high-cost digital materials without knowing their options. Not later than the 30th day before the first day of classes for any semester, the institution must provide a course schedule that includes: Detailed Material Lists: A list of all required and recommended materials for each course; Retail Pricing: The retail price for each required material; Specific Identifiers: Author, publisher, copyright date, and ISBN (if available); Open Educational Resources (OER): A clear indication of whether materials are OER.

One specific example was what I experienced this [REDACTED] semester for [REDACTED]. Classes did not begin until the week of [REDACTED]. But the required course content was not available until days before the 1st class and definitely not in time for me to address accommodation needs. I was charged for this course, while not having required notices under HB 1027 or ability to effectively seek [REDACTED] accommodations as a result. Additionally, the first day of lab is not until after [REDACTED] date and not in time to be able to have enough information to withdraw until Sept 19th.

As a result, Texas State not only failed to comply with HB 1027, but was able to obtain extra tuition and fees for a course I was never able to attend as a result.

I have already attempted to resolve with the University to no avail.

Complaint

My name is Trale Tevis. I am a native Texan, and in November 2024 I returned after a decade in New York in order to work for the University of Houston. I resigned my position there in January of this year, and I would like to tell you why.

I was hired as a "resource sharing specialist" within the library. I was restricted to interlibrary loan borrowing, a task that took me 20-30 minutes a day and I was expected to do absolutely nothing with the rest of my 40 hours. This is in spite of the fact that I have my MSLIS and I was qualified for all types of projects and further training within the library. As a second-career librarian, I needed the experience and was denied at every turn. Every attempt I made to address this was met with total apathy. I learned over time the library was a Potemkin village - administration hires three people for every one job in order to justify their own positions. I also learned the actual content of my "job" was to baby-sit my dysfunctional manager, who showed up at 11:30 am or later every day without consequence. He was shockingly bad at his job in more ways than I can fit in this letter, and administration always turned a blind eye.

Considering I moved back to Texas for this job; this has all been devastating to me. I will never have anything good to say about the University of Houston and I now consider it an embarrassment to our state. The level of incompetence, laziness, and institutional rot I encountered at UH I would have considered structurally impossible before I experienced it myself. I am sending this letter to as many elected officials as I can, not solely out of spite, but because I think it is the right thing to do. The University of Houston is academically sub-par, institutionally disordered, and ultimately a waste of the taxpayer's money.

I leave you with four recommendations-

- 1) Cut funding to the university in order to force them to become less wasteful and more efficient.
- 2) Hire a third-party consultancy to aggressively audit the university.
- 3) Pressure them to perform national searches for every position instead of promoting and appointing from within. This practice has led to many of the university's problems. Instead of attracting talent, they repel it.
- 4) This is specific to the library - end faculty status for librarians as was done recently at A&M. Faculty librarianship is an outdated, toxic caste system that harms everyone.

I pursued a formal grievance through the University of Houston after being removed from my research position following an explosion and my subsequent request for a Safety Data Sheet (SDS) for the material involved. During the grievance process, I presented evidence that directly contradicted the justification provided by my supervisor, including a documented timeline and supporting materials.

Despite this, the university concluded that there was no retaliation and denied my grievance. My concern is not simply the outcome, but the process by which that outcome was reached. The decision disregards key evidence and relies on subjective claims and assertions that are inconsistent with the documented record.

I escalated these concerns to the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board. However, their response did not address the substance of my concerns regarding fairness, evidentiary standards, or due process, and instead deferred to the institution's findings without meaningful independent evaluation. Both the University of Houston and the Coordinating Board have repeatedly and adamantly refused to engage with or review the evidence I have submitted.

EXAMPLES OF DISPARATE-IMPACT INDOCTRINATION IN UT DALLAS COMPLIANCE TRAINING

> "An AI tool denies loan applications from certain neighborhoods but cannot explain why. The loan officer approves the denials anyway since the AI reviewed more data than a human could."

> "An employee notices that an AI hiring tool flags women with employment gaps twice as often as men. They document the pattern and report it to HR and IT for investigation."

> "An AI tool recommends repairs in wealthy areas over low-income neighborhoods. An analyst uploads the report with resident income data to a free AI tool for a second opinion."
