As the designated spokesperson and superintendent for the Muleshoe Independent School District, I am issuing the following statement:

On June 4, 2026, the Muleshoe ISD (the “District”) administration received a report from state law enforcement officials that a District employee was arrested for allegedly engaging in an inappropriate relationship with a District student. This individual is no longer employed with the District.

The District has made all required reports to state authorities and regulatory agencies as required by law. The District will continue to cooperate with law enforcement and other agencies to the fullest extent permitted by law. However, state and federal law prohibit the District from disclosing personally identifiable student information, as well as confidential personnel information. Therefore, the District cannot comment further on this matter.

All Muleshoe ISD employees receive regular training and warnings regarding proper professional conduct with students and minors and are required to report any suspected misconduct. The District’s policies concerning professional boundaries and improper relationships between staff and students are rigorously enforced. Violations are not tolerated. As such, it is our practice at Muleshoe ISD to notify parents in a timely and transparent manner, as it is important that they continue to have conversations with their children about reporting anything or anyone that makes them feel uncomfortable or threatened in any way.

Please be assured that the District takes its responsibility for student and child safety extremely seriously. I am grateful for the assistance and cooperation provided to the District from state and local authorities. The administration encourages anyone with concerns of suspected improper conduct between a District employee and a student or minor to immediately contact school administration and law enforcement.
