Robert,

Thanks for your note and the opportunity to comment. A Harvest Texas spokesperson has provided the following statement:

“Harvest Texas continues to support the Howard-to-Solstice transmission project and its grid-reliability objectives but also asks that the Commission consider residence safety and health issues while approving any specific route-selection including Link 238 because of its proximity to a residence and the resulting site-specific land-use and property impacts. This has been and remains a route-selection issue. Harvest Texas does not oppose the project as a whole.

Harvest Texas does not dispute that Mr. Sun is its owner. But the suggestion that Mr. Sun or Harvest Texas is part of or acting for the Chinese Communist Party or the Chinese government is categorically false. Mr. Sun is a respected international businessman, whose companies are not supported by or a part of the Chinese Government and that, in fact, were largely funded through investment of American investors.

Harvest Texas has gone above and beyond to make this clear and voluntarily subjected itself to review and clearance by the Committee on Foreign Investment in the United States (CFIUS). The resulting National Security Agreement addressed – and continues to address – the national security concerns identified by CFIUS and remains in full effect notwithstanding the allegations made in Senator Cornyn’s 2024 letter. Nothing Harvest Texas has requested in the PUC proceeding would provide access to or control of the electric grid. Harvest Texas is participating as an affected landowner in a public routing process.”
